

## **PROGRAM**

The Scouting From Home program was developed, which helped leaders shift meetings and programs to online forums including virtual meetings and backyard camping.

Over 6,250 youth and adults participated in Klondike derbies, Cub and Scouts BSA camporees and other district events.

**40 Scouts** participated in the **National Youth Leadership Training Course** held over two full weekends.

Our volunteers and staff organized membership recruiting carnivals, online recruiting resources and in-person recruiting events that engaged more than 1,000 new families into Scouting.
