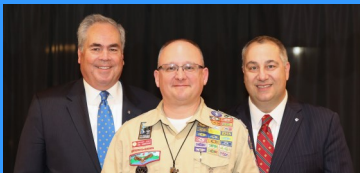
# COUNCIL KEY 3 MESSAGE

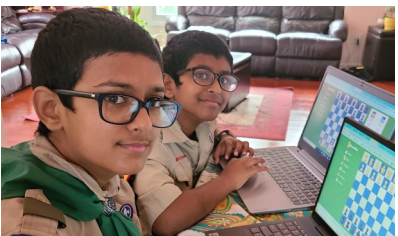
## PROGRAM

The **Scouting From Home** program was developed, which helped leaders shift meetings and programs to online forums including **virtual meetings** and **backyard camping**.

Over **6,250** youth and adults participated in Klondike derbies, Cub and Scouts BSA camporees and other **district events**.

**40 Scouts** participated in the **National Youth Leadership Training Course** held over two full weekends.

Our volunteers and staff organized **membership recruiting carnivals**, **online recruiting resources** and **in-person recruiting events** that engaged more than **1,000 new families** into Scouting.



## CAMPING

Over **1,400 Scouts** enjoyed safe and fun programs at our **camp facilities**.

Over **300 Cub Scouts** participated in **day camp** opportunities.

Over **1,300 Scouts** earned more than **2,900 merit badges** by participating in the summer **PPC Outdoor Academy**, a virtual course of merit badges and programs.

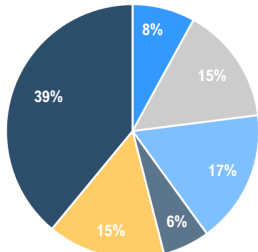

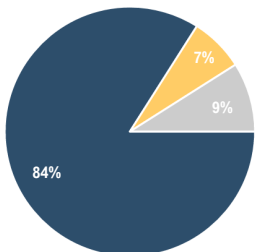
Unaudited financial statement as of December 31, 2020
