

Black River District

Overall registration is down 9.5%

Cub Scouts: -6%

- Tigers have an increase of 60 cubs; a 30% increase!!
- Cubs (Wolfs/Bears) are -15%
- Webelos/AOL are -13%

Boy Scouts : -2%

Venturing is down 19 Scouts, or -16%



- 2013 Results:
 - -Growth in Cub Scouts: -106
 - -New Tiger Cubs: 255
 - Packs with Tiger Den of 11 or more:29%
 - -Growth in Boy Scouts: -88
 - -61 Venturing members
 - -Started Soccer Pack









Issues:

- Scattered decline in new Scouts
- Scattered attrition (9 Packs lost 10 or more Scouts)

Strategy

- Identify troubled Packs (7)
- Identify underserved localities
- Form Rapid Response Team
- Schedule District Recruiting Events (Archery, Basketball, Rocket Launch)
- Relocate Gold Rush within District area





2015 Plan

- Continue with current strategy for Cub Scout
 Recruiting and W2S It is effective
- Form Pack Support Teams
- Focus Commissioners' efforts
- Redesign Roundtable format
- Promote Roundtable participation
- Stress leader training / Wood Badge





Pack Support Teams

- Consist of 3+ members from neighboring units
- 3-4 month intense focus
- Assist in promoting and conducting events
- Leader mentoring
- Suggest training
- Assist in Pack planning
- Serve as consulting resource after the 3-4 months



Munsee District

2014

- Recruiting events in Carteret, Elizabeth, Hillside, Linden, Perth Amboy, & Roselle
- Council-run STEM event in Linden
- Achieved Silver level in JTE
- Only district in Council to meet Cub Scout recruitment goals (405 added since September!)





Munsee District

2015

- Munsee now has a Vice Chair of Membership
- Recruitment events already planned in Elizabeth, Iselin, Linden, Perth Amboy, Roselle, & Roselle Park
- Identified some units more immediately at risk who we plan to work with more closely
- Hoping to develop more tools to help us better market Scouting to prospective parents

- Trained and Assisted over 25 Packs with Springtime Recruitment Efforts
- Over 60% of Units saw significant growth in Membership
- District Roundtable attendance has significantly increased and new format has offered new Cub Scout Leaders and Members valuable resources

- Hosted a STEM Recruiting event with close to 100 attendees in Piscataway
- 5 Bridgewater Packs started a joint Cubmaster Initiative
 - Collective Recruitment
 - First ever joint Cub Scouting event Turkey Shoot
 - Aggressively marketing Schools and Superintendent in areas with need
 - Offering support to surrounding Packs and Troops

- 2014 showed a negative 4.96% loss of Scouts in traditional groups
- 2014 showed a negative unit growth
- Our 2015 district goal is to show a positive scout growth
- Our 2015 district goal is to show a positive unit growth





- 2.8% growth in market share growth across the district.
 - Cub Scout density increased by 7.62%.
 - Venturing density increased by 8.26%.
- We showed a positive .91% increase in new Scout opportunities at the Cub Scout level.
- We increased Scout retention by 1.62% for 76.4% total retention rate.





- Part of membership growth will be a push for training beyond the basics
- Continued weekly updates of district and council information
- Continued maintenance of email contact information
- Continued participation in town events, such as street fairs.
